Mayor's Key Speaking Points

The Province has banned short-term rentals in rental accommodation. Fines for breaching the Provincial order start at \$100,000 for individuals - higher for corporations. (See Ontario Regulation 119/20 Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act for full details). The Province has not determined a date for the resumption of essential services.

On the water Muskoka marinas have all but closed their doors unless you are a permanent resident with water access only and need assistance.

Construction and services. Don't put people's lives at risk by asking contractors to do work that can wait. Consider others.

Travelling between residents is not advised. If you are in Muskoka, stay there. If you are not in Muskoka, stay home. Stay put, stay safe.

If we work together, if we isolate, if we respect each other we can get through this.

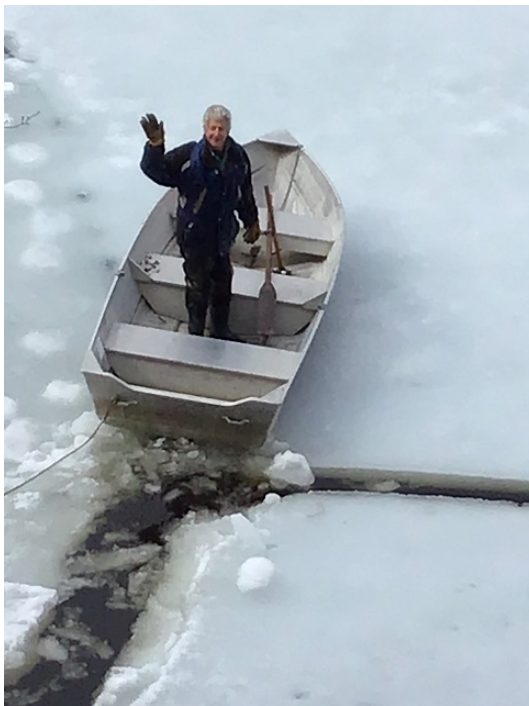

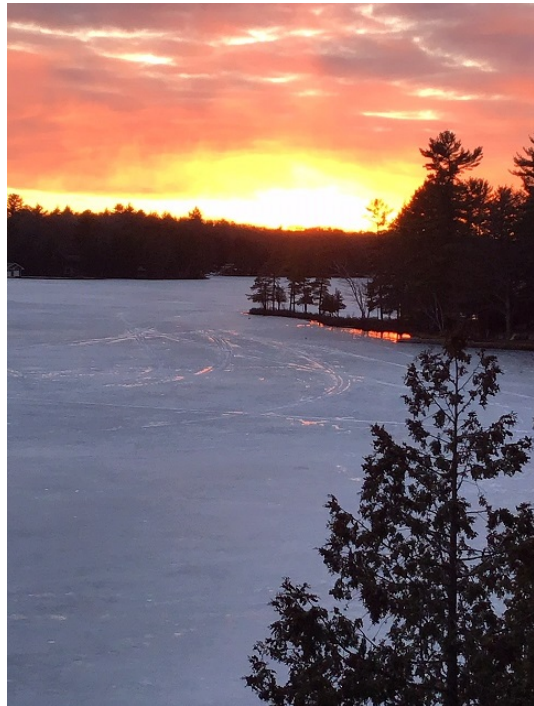

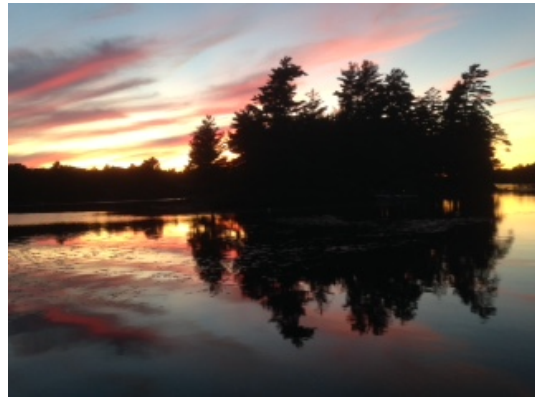
